Background

EXISTING PARTNERSHIP

- The MoECRT and WB team have already discussed key areas of technical assistance, including an assessment of financial implications of universalizing pre-primary education, and an assessment of learning loss.

Proposed World Bank Program (1)

- In 2018 The World Bank Human Capital Project in Bali was launched, MOF/BKF designated as Human Capital focal point. In 2020 The World Bank Team met Ibu Sri Mulyani and Ibu Satu on Human Capital Development Policy Loan (DPL)
- In May 2021 - Approval of WB Country Partnership Framework with HC Pillar and inclusion of Human Capital DPL. In September 2021 onwards - Discussions with GOI on results areas, prior actions and implementing arrangements. And First half of 2022 - Approval of DPL, upon successful completion of prior actions.
- Program in line with Indonesia Country Partnership Framework (CPF) TA 2021 s.d. 2025, with focus on: (a) strengthening economic competitiveness and resilience, (b) improving supply of and access to sustainable infrastructure services, (c) nurturing human capital and (d) Strengthening management of natural assets, natural resource-based livelihoods and disaster resilience.

Proposed World Bank Program (2)

- In particular the WB support program in relation to the HR improvement program, namely the Development Policy Loan (DPL) to improve Indonesia's HR development through increasing the effectiveness of public financing for HR and protecting existing HR investment programs.
- WB support in the form of budget support in the form of Loan, namely First Indonesia Human Capital Development Policy Loan (P175742) worth US\$ 400 million, active starting March 15, 2022.
- The World Bank assesses the current policies of the Ministry of Education and Culture, including the National Assessment Program, Sekolah Penggerak and Seleksi Kompetensi Bidang, in line with the Reform Area of the World Bank program which focuses on nurturing human capital of:
 - Reform area 2: will transform teacher hiring and student assessment for improved learning outcomes.

Proposed World Bank Program (3)

- In addition, Early Childhood Education is also one of the focus areas of reform
